Executive Director's Note

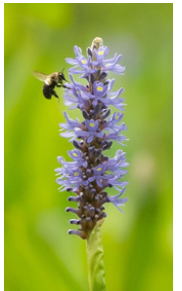

What a remarkable year it's been for our land trust! As I reflect on our accomplishments, I'm reminded that our success is thanks to the shared commitment and generosity of community members, donors, partners, and volunteers who believe in protecting our region's lands and waters.



We began 2024 with a major milestone – achieving first time land trust accreditation through the Land Trust Accreditation Commission. I'll never forget the phone call from the Commission telling us we'd achieved full accreditation, which came in while I was at home with my newborn son, Oliver. Just as Oliver has grown a lot this past year, so has the Chautauqua Watershed Conservancy.

Through our free Yard Smarts (formerly LakeScapes) program, we reached hundreds of new property owners, offering them guidance on eco-friendly landscaping, native planting, and storm water management. Expanding Water Protection: Chautauqua County's first farm easement

The Conservancy acquired a new conservation easement in 2024 – and the very first farm easement in Chautauqua County!

This farm easement (outlined in yellow on the map at right) is located on the lands of Mud Creek Dairy, an active dairy farm on Bloomer Road in the Town of Chautauqua whose pastures are bisected by a small tributary that drains directly into Mud Creek and then into the north basin of Chautauqua Lake.

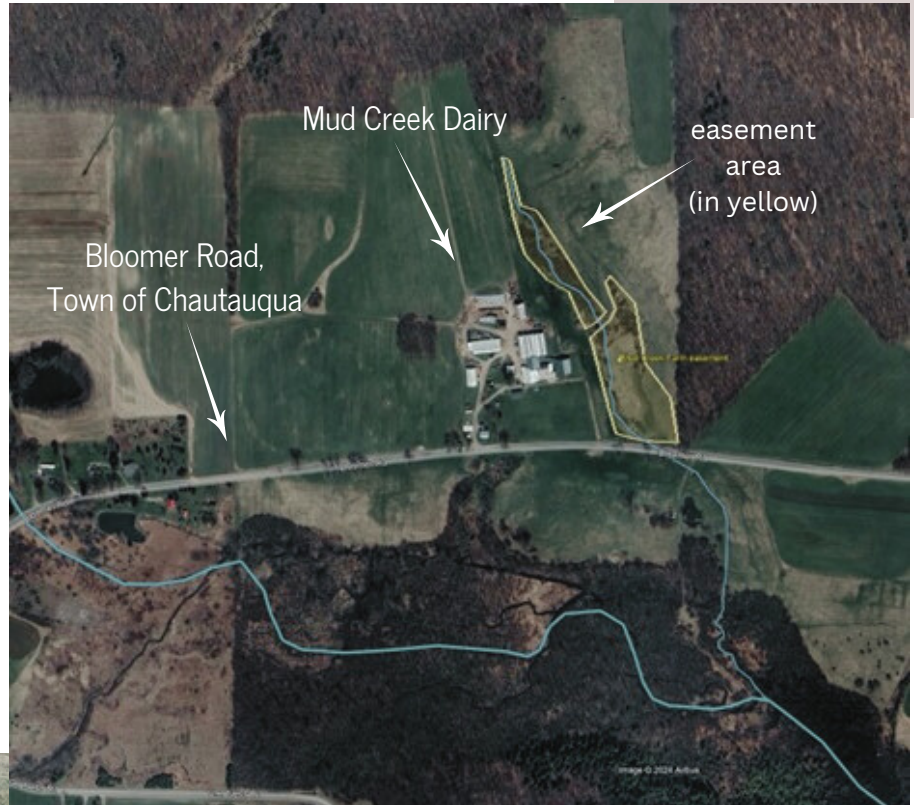

Even though the farm and its lands benefit from having a steady supply of water from the stream to irrigate crops and water livestock, the erosion caused by cattle crossing the stream and its surrounding floodplain is negatively impacting water quality on the farm and anywhere downstream from there.

Additionally, during times of heavy rainfall or snowmelt, the mud near the creek can be so deep that cows have gotten stuck to the point that they needed to be rescued.

To address these issues, six acres of the farm located near the creek were fenced off to exclude cattle and stabilize the land. The area was then removed from farm production and placed under a conservation easement. A raised cattle crossing and special water trough were installed to ensure safe passage across the creek and clean drinking water access for the cows.

These changes will prevent the cattle from feeding, watering, and excreting waste in the area of the tributary and allow a vegetative buffer to grow along the creek, all of which will result in cleaner water entering Chautauqua Lake through Mud Creek. And farm operators will also no longer have to worry about cows getting stuck and hurt as they try to navigate the muddy area that bisects their farm.



This project was managed and designed by the Chautauqua County Soil and Water Conservation District.

The Chautauqua Watershed Conservancy now holds the easement and will monitor it in perpetuity to ensure continued compliance.

Eco-Education For A Sustainable Future

2024 was another busy year for Conservancy educational outreach and activities. Our LakeScapes program (now called Yard Smarts) was again in full swing. The program promotes watershed-friendly landscaping and lawn care to not only help create essential wildlife habitats and beautiful gardens but also teach homeowners how their yards can better absorb and filter runoff and improve water quality. Roughly 3,500 miles were traveled and 200 consultations completed in 2024 alone, bringing the total number of homeowner consultations to nearly 800 since the program began in 2020.

We partnered with Royal Fern Nursery to present a mini-meadow workshop where participants learned about the benefits of shrinking lawn size and incorporating native plants. We also teamed up with Chautauqua Marina for our 4th annual native plant buffer bonanza and plant sale, which highlighted the importance of native plants and their role in enhancing water quality and lake health.



Another significant achievement was the creation of an educational video, *Our Lakeshore Connection*, which illustrates the importance of lake shore buffers and the connection between land and water. (You can watch the video on our YouTube channel and website.)

Our Education and Engagement Committee was also especially active this year. The committee's focus is to engage the public, raise awareness of our mission, and promote a sense of place and respect for ecosystems while empowering individuals to create sustainable environments within their communities. To support these efforts, the committee engaged with the community through a variety of outreach activities, including educational displays at local events such as the Wild America Nature Festival and Fall Foliage Festival at Panama Rocks, Prendergast Library Community Block Party, SUNY JCC Earthfest, Lakewood Library Earth Fest, Cummins Health Fair, and several farmers' markets.

Committee members were also active participants in several events such as the Chautauqua Lake Dragon Boat Races, a Halloween Trunk or Treat, and Jamestown Christmas Parade. What an amazing year of connecting with our community!



A Year of Conservation & Connection

2024 was packed with many exciting projects and fun activities at the Conservancy!

In June, we launched *Wine on the Trail* – a new and engaging event created and led by Land Specialist Bethany O'Hagan and Conservationist Carol Markham. Each month, they explore one of our nature preserves, inviting the public to join them for a relaxing outdoor

walk with a beverage of their choice. It's been a great success and a great way to connect with nature!



As a nationally accredited land trust, we're responsible for having clear, readable signage on all our properties. So with some help from our conservation committee and handyman John McCarthy, Land Specialist Bethany O'Hagan was able to begin the on-going process of updating and installing signs, as well as new kiosks and trail maps, at all of our preserves.



Other notable highlights include:

- Closing on a new conservation easement
- Continuing riverbank restoration work along the Chadakoin River
- Cleaning up 30+ miles of the Martin E. Cobb Waterway Trail
- Removing and treating invasive species at some of our preserves with assistance from WNY PRISM, local Boy Scouts, and other volunteers
- Conducting aquatic invasive species surveys in Chautauqua Lake and Hemlock Woolly Adelgid (HWA) surveys on local hemlock trees
- Installing memorial benches at preserves
- Recruiting new stewards for our preserves
- Volunteering and tabling at a variety of local events to better connect with our community

We have many more conservation activities lined up for 2025 and beyond, so stay tuned!



Restoring & Revitalizing Water, Habitats, & Communities

Our ecological restoration and improvement efforts made great strides in 2024!



Invasive Species

We partnered with WNY PRISM to combat invasive species at our Cassadaga Lakes Nature Park, working to safeguard the sensitive native plant communities that exist there. At the McCray Peckinpaugh Preserve, we removed invasives such as Japanese Knotweed and Multiflora rose and will plant native shrubs and wildflowers in their place in spring 2025.

We continued our role as the region's aquatic invasive species task force, conducting on-water surveys to keep an eye out for new threats, while actively addressing existing ones such as water chestnut and Starry Stonewort. In 2024 alone, we removed 200+ invasive plants from the lake's outlet and even more from ponds at Maplehurst Golf Club.



Wetlands

At the Southern Tier Brewery Wetland Preserve, we started evaluating the feasibility of building a series of engineered wetlands to help manage excess flow from Goose Creek during storms. Since the preserve is located close to the mouth of the creek (just upstream of Chautauqua Lake), this project has the potential to reduce erosion and downstream flooding while also filtering sediment and nutrients from the creek water before it enters the lake. When the creek is not flooding, the wetlands would retain water, creating valuable habitat for frogs, salamanders, ducks, and other wildlife.





Chadakoin Riverbank

We made major progress in 2024 restoring the collapsing banks of the Chadakoin River in downtown Jamestown. With funding from the City of Jamestown, the failing river banks were stabilized, regraded, and rebuilt with stacked rock to mimic a more natural river corridor. Just before the first snow fell, we completed the first round of native vegetation planting, with more to come in 2025.

This project will not only create a sustainable, erosion-resistant riverbank but will also be a beautiful new attraction along the city's Riverwalk as well as a healthy and thriving habitat for fish, turtles, and other wildlife.



Waterways Cleanup

For decades, unprecedented massive logjams and debris have been clogging up Cassadaga Creek and Conewango Creek, disrupting flow, causing flooding and property damage, and creating hazards for boaters. With assistance from certified arborist Vince Liuzzo, we identified the worst obstructions in these waterways and removed many of them. Funded by Chautauqua County, the City of Jamestown, and the Conewango Creek Watershed Association, crews mapped and cleared hazards and obstructions along the Chadakoin River in Jamestown and Falconer, and as far south as Russell, PA, on Conewango Creek.



The biggest achievement was the herculean task of removing hundreds of fallen trees and dozens of massive logjams from Cassadaga Creek to allow safe passage of both water and kayakers. A continuous stretch of 20.4 miles of Cassadaga Creek, from Kabob downstream to its confluence with the Chadakoin River, is now safely navigable again.

To prevent similar situations coming about in the future, we also developed a draft management plan for the county's major waterways.

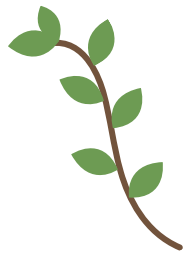
